Dear friends,

I hope this letter finds you well. I first must apologize as I have not kept in contact with all you as much as I would have liked. Internship has kept me busy. I continue to

appreciate your prayers and financial support. I am amazed at how quickly this time has gone by. I am finishing up my internship at Trinity Lutheran in Mt. Morris, IL and will graduate from Trinity Lutheran Seminary on May 19.

Last week at my internship site's midweek worship service, we talked about Abraham and Sarah as we are focusing on God's covenants during Lent. Pr. Josh noted that Abraham laughed. He laughed at the thought of himself and Sarah conceiving a child at their ages. Abraham laughed at God's daring idea.

When I first considered a call to seminary to be a pastor, I too, laughed. I laughed at God's daring idea that a person who loves math and struggles in English could be a pastor who reads and writes for a living.

I recently found out that I have been assigned to the Northern Illinois Synod (Region 5) to serve my first call. I will begin reading congregational profiles soon and will eventually begin the interview process. Taking a mission trip is a perfect opportunity to serve, love and grow together. So, give this some thought and prayer.


