




The custom of commemorating all of the saints of the church on a single day goes back at least to the third century. All Saints



LORD OF THE LAKES -CONFIRMATION PROGRAM

Dear Friends in Christ,

We have an exciting year ahead for our confirmation kids. Our youth group meets every week on Wednesday evenings. Two middle school evening meetings on the first Wednesday and fourth Wednesday and one high school evening meeting as well as one art night for all

kids each month. (Week 1 Middle School, Week 2 Art night, Week 3 High School, Week 4 Middle School, this is the typical monthly pattern)

While attendance is not monitored, it is my hope that you will bring your kids to join in. Like so many parts of our lives it is time and energy that builds us into the people we can become. If we invest in our spiritual lives, we will grow. Wednesday nights are a great opportunity for our youth to grow spiritually. It is practice for building in the rhythms of grace in our lives. A rhythm we are hoping will continue throughout the entirety of the lives of our children.

The requirements for confirmation are simply two things:

- 1. Every student is expected to take notes on 10 different sermons per year from grade six to grade nine. That's 40 over four years. (Forty could be achieved in one year!)
- 2. Every student is expected in ninth grade to attend 4 Wednesday evening sessions on Luther's small Catechism. This begins on March 6th and runs through March 27th. Confirmation Sunday will be April 7th. Please mark your calendars now and be sure you are able to attend and even invite family and friends in advance. Parents are strongly encouraged to attend these classes along with their kids. I have been told by parents who have been through this study that this time is very rich and rewarding as they are able to talk about faith issues with their children. At the end of these sessions each student will present their own personal creed to the congregation on confirmation Sunday, April 7, 2019.

In addition we strongly encourage our kids to join in with helping at service projects scheduled by our youth team. This is an opportunity for them to learn what it means to give of our time to help others. Each year our youth also lead one Sunday morning service in its entirety. This is highly anticipated every year by our congregation. On a personal note it is one of my favorite Sunday's every year.

The mission trips, while not mandatory, are also highly encouraged. These trips truly change lives. You are welcome to ask any of the kids who went to the Twin Cities last summer about their experience there. This year we are excited to announce our trip location in mid-October.


In conclusion, it is my hope that you will make your kids available. Please join in on our youth events. We welcome your input, ideas, suggestions as well as your assistance from time to time.

Reformation Day

During the sixteenth century, some German Lutheran churches celebrated an annual thanksgiving day for the Reformation. In 1667 the festival was set for October 31 or the Sunday prior, since by then it was popularly believed that on this date in 1517 Martin Luther posted the Ninety-Five Theses on the Wittenberg church door, in anticipation of people coming to worship on November 1, All Saints Day, to view saints' relics. The date on which to commemorate the life and achievements of Martin Luther is February 18, his death day in 1546. The point of this festival is the continuing need for perpetual reformation of all churches.

Sunday, October 28 is Reformation Sunday


In many congregations, Reformation Sunday is treated as a sort of "Lutheran heritage" day, a time for singing chorales and remembering the theological reforms of the sixteenth century that gave birth to Lutheranism. In other parishes, a greater focus is placed on the church's need for continual reform; the church's history is secondary to an emphasis on the issues and needs of the church today. Both approaches have much to commend them.

But the true center of this day is found in the readings. In Jeremiah we are reminded of a new covenant and the promise that God will forgive, the promise written on our hearts. In Romans Paul brings the full force of the law to bear on our lives: "since all have sinned and fall short of

the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). With this reality, how can we have any hope apart from divine grace? Finally, in the gospel reading from John we are reminded that our freedom comes from Christ alone. We are neither bound to the past nor slaves to our anxieties of the present.

Psalm 46 brings all of this together with the powerful proclamation: "God is our refuge and strength." The God we know in the person of Jesus is the one we can turn to in times of crisis, the one we call upon in times of fear, the one we trust to pour out mercy and forgiveness upon us. This Jesus is our solid foundation. In a world of chaos, confusion, and change there is a constant: the enduring and life-giving grace of God.

On this Reformation Sunday—as every Sunday—we remember this good news!
