
All groups and individuals are encouraged to use the new Bunn coffee maker. Instructions are on the wall to the left of the unit. Enjoy a cup!

On a side note, the church did have a Bunn coffee maker over a decade ago similar to the one that was recently purchased thanks to another generous donor. Buildings & Grounds determined that the unit used an excessive amount of energy and sold that unit to a commercial buyer. The difference between that unit and this one is that the specs for the newer model claim that excessive energy consumption is not an issue. Buildings & Grounds will monitor the energy use and take appropriate measures if it is indeed an issue.
