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The first thing I wanted to do when I became Council President was to meet with the office staff including pastor, youth leader, office administrators, financial secretary, and our music director. I was interested to know exactly what their individual roles were and how they are connected, the barriers they run into when it comes to getting their work done efficiently, their expectations of me as Council President and finally what Council could do to assist them in performing their jobs more efficiently.

The result of that meeting was an eye-opening experience! Historically, if you go back and look at year end financials, you will notice that the Personnel and Office Expenses always come in under budget. There is an old saying, "the squeaky wheel gets greased". These folks enjoy being a part of the church staff, they realize their roles as church financial secretaries and office administrators are a little different and feel different than what one would find in the private sector. They do whatever it takes to make things work and they don't make a lot of noise. Interestingly, they all shared similar hindrances with their jobs and those revolved around the lack of up-to-date technology and frustration with the inconsistency of the Internet performance. What we have for hardware, software, and everything associated with the Internet effect not only them but pastor, our youth ministry leader, and our pianist!

Council members will come and go. Members of Teams and Committees will change over time. Office administrators and financial secretaries will change with retirement. The one constant is stored within the walls of our church offices and on the website. This includes our church records, financial records, membership records, inventories, meeting minutes and our constitution. The software and hardware for maintaining these records should be up to date and functioning properly. We need to be assured that no matter what personnel changes occur, the next person can pick up and run with it. If they have a problem, there is a "contact" to get them up and running again! We need to know that when the worship service begins, the computer connected to the projector that casts our worship service outline on the screen, will most likely work.

We are blessed to have a Business Management Team made up of very smart, talented individuals with a business background. In 2023 as unbudgeted needs are presented from B&G and now Technology, they are working diligently to assist Council with a plan to prioritize and financially take care of these needs. The items were not a part of our 2023 Budget because Budget work began in the summer of 2022. It had to be ready for Council to approve in October and presented to our congregation and voted on in November. No one was aware of these needs at that time.

The lesson learned from this is that sometimes rather than assume everything is okay because we haven't noticed a "squeaky wheel", we need to check on it anyway. Measures have been taken to avoid future high dollar surprises. A Capitol Equipment/Furnishings Inventory has been created so that items can be analyzed for determination of what may need to be replaced and the approximate cost over the next 5 Years. These items will appear in future budgets as needed. Many volunteers have given and are currently giving generously of their Time and Talents as we work through and identify our needs. We ask for God to continue to give us wisdom and guidance in this process.




