We continue to pray every day for guidance and wisdom in making decisions that impact all of us involved at Lord of the Lakes. Since my last writing, we had a little crisis in the office that forced us to take some emergency action on the path to resolving a few of our technology issues. First, we found

the answering machine was not working properly and finally were able to get a representative from our current telephone service to come out and resolve that problem. This company has been a real challenge to work with! Council members Tennille Peterson and Wayne Ludkey have been working countless hours in cooperation with our office staff and consultant Randy Korus advising as they try and resolve issues with our email, out of date software, transferring data and other tech related problems. We purchased a new computer and monitor for the office administration and Office 365 software will have been installed on all 4 of the office computers including the Office Administration, Financial Secretary, Pastor, and Youth Leader by the time you read the newsletter. We were able to accomplish this by using Project Fund-21202 with the balance coming from Fortify Investment account (Linda Zillges gift). By taking monies from these funds, we have not impacted our operating budget at all, and we are getting a little closer to making our office folks smile again. We continue to work on resolving our email issues! The web page has been temporarily put on the back burner until we get these higher priority areas of concern resolved.

Since the end of February, we have received additional monies from members of our congregation donated specifically for "Technology" that will assist us in meeting these needs. Your generosity is overwhelming.! Next month I look forward to updating you on what we were able to accomplish toward meeting our technology goals without impacting our operating budget!

Congratulations to the members of our Wednesday Night Youth Group! Love their new name – SWAG (Saved With Amazing Grace) This is a fabulous group of kids that I, too, get the privilege of working with throughout the year as they volunteer for various worship assistant duties and help us in other ways around Lord of the Lakes. They are smart, dedicated, hard-working, love their church family and Jesus Christ! We need more adults willing to volunteer to work with this group. They are special, and it will be a worthwhile opportunity if you are so inclined.

Welcome new members! Wow! What an excellent group of adults and children! We are so glad to have you! Choosing a church is a personal decision. So glad you chose us!

Greetings from the land of finance! Last month I introduced the amazing team of people we have guiding our congregation financially. This month the focus is on the nuts and bolts of the budget process.

Treasurer Report

Last November, you, our congregation, voted on our 2023 budget. But how is the budget developed?

Our office team handles the electronic recording of all financial transactions for the church. Each financial transaction is recorded to a specific account in our computer system. We have accounts for everything – expenses like office supplies, inside maintenance, payroll, subscriptions, and income such as offerings and donations. This detailed tracking allows us to easily produce a preliminary budget report that shows all income and expenses for the year. Since this process begins during the summer, we project costs for the remainder of the year based on data from the previous year.

Once the draft budget is created, it is sent to committees for review and feedback. Council, committees, and the administrative team look at their respective expenses for the year, determine if they are over/under budget, and make recommendations for the next year's budget. Recommendations are then sent to the finance team for further analysis and adjustments. This back and forth continues until a final budget proposal is agreed upon by the council and the finance team. The budget is then put forth for consideration and vote by the congregation (you).

Our budget is created, but how do we know what we will have for income? Simple answer is, we don't know. I'm not going to lie – that freaked me out a bit (ok, a lot) coming into this role. I'm familiar with personal and business budgeting – I can reasonably expect 'x' amount of dollars every <insert timeframe here>. Doesn't work that way in the church. Income history from previous years, combined with current year data gives us a good guess on where we might end up, but it is only a guess. Fortunately, we are blessed with

- · A generous congregation
- A fiscally responsible team

For those that attended the congregational meeting, you know the challenges to our budget due to aging systems requiring replacement – specifically technology, parking lot lights, 3 furnaces/air conditioners. Council is working closely with Buildings & Grounds, the Administrative Team, and Business Management Team to determine what repairs/replacements "need" to be versus "should" be completed. We are also analyzing whether the costs can be managed within the confines of our current budget.

Strategically, we are undergoing an audit of all major systems to determine when maintenance or replacement will be necessary. Our hope is to prolong the lifespan of systems but also begin proactively allocating monies for eventual replacement. Additionally, all committees are drafting "Needs, Wants and Dreams" lists so we can continue to our shift to proactive budgeting.

We ask for your continuing prayers for guidance, wisdom, and discernment as we collectively work to honor our Lord with the gifts of this congregation.
