WOW!!! Thank you for enthusiastically showing up on Sunday, July 16 for our Congregational Meeting! We communicated with you that your presence was needed and a vote of YES was needed and you did not disappoint! Prior to this meeting we had been praying fervently about our situation asking God to give us guidance and wisdom in making our decisions throughout the process. Ninety-four votes were cast, and the decision was unanimous in favor of funding the \$26,500 needed for capital projects! You are amazing and God does answer prayers!

The big question is always how are we going to pay for this? We did have a plan. We are in a stronger financial position this year than we were at the same time last year because our income has increased, and we have been very conservative with our spending, yet we do not want to become over-confident because we still have six months left in this budget year! Our plan is to pay for half of the cost of this capital project out of our General Operating Account. Oshkosh Heating and Air, our chosen vendor, was gracious enough to offer to finance the remaining balance at zero interest if we had it paid in full by the end of December. Our plan is to make monthly installment payments.

At the meeting I had the pleasure of making a very unexpected, exciting announcement! An extremely generous donation of \$5,000 was anonymously given by a member to initiate the campaign to raise additional money for this project. They further demonstrated their love for Lord of the Lakes by having it announced that they will match any additional amount that comes in for the project, up to \$5,000 for the possibility of at least \$15,000! Wayne Ludkey, our Stewardship Chair, immediately added an additional tile to our Vanco Giving tab on our website (www.lordofthelakes.net) and members can go online and donate to this special cause. Thank you, Wayne! You can also scan the QR Code below to donate today!



The generosity of our membership is overwhelming! We would be remiss if I did not once again mention the \$3500 donation from Tom Zillges to fund the parking lot light project. Those lights are much needed and no doubt our snowplow man, Dave, will appreciate them this winter! Had Tom not done this, our ask would have been \$30,000 today.

I look forward to joint meetings with leaders of Buildings & Grounds as well as the Business Management Team as we assess our needs and prepare budgets for the coming year. We have accomplished so much,

yet there is more to do. With your continued generosity and loving support, it will all happen if He thinks it should.

Hello! We are half-way through 2023, which means we are half-way through our 2023 budget. Earlier today, our congregation overwhelmingly approved a budget amendment to fund much needed capital improvements. Several members have already come forward with financial pledges, and even a match offer, to help fund these improvements. Thank you!!! These generous gifts assist us in protecting and growing our operating fund. A healthy operating fund helps us create an emergency fund, fund future projects, and ultimately allows us to be proactive with our budgeting. With continued congregational support, these financial goals will be achieved. Thank you all for your tremendous support!

As of June 30, 2023, our operating fund has a balance of \$133,605.67. Based on our budget, we were anticipating a deficit of \$6,318 at mid-year, but due to the awesome outpouring of financial support by our congregation, we are currently ahead of budget by \$29,875! This is fantastic news!!! Please keep in mind that much of this abundance is a result of one-time gifts being made earlier in the year. We still have 6 months to go, and our operating fund must go the distance.

Our financial challenges are far from over (future projects, mortgage, etc) but if we learned anything from today's congregational meeting, it's that we can accomplish much if we 1.) seek God's help and wisdom, 2.) communicate, and 3.) work together as a team.


